➔ **You can generate a list of employers who indicate they consider 1Ls by selecting that criteria under "Organizations that hire." You can also generate a comparison chart that shows the summer hiring information for those employers.**

4. I want to compare diversity information for employers with a certain practice area.

➔ **You can generate a list of employers in that practice area and then create a comparison chart of the diversity breakdown of those employers. You can also find information about diversity initiatives and same-sex partner benefits on the Workplace Questionnaire.**

5. I have just started my job search and have a wide range of employers I'm interested in. Can I save my list of results while I refine my search?

➔ **Once you have a list of results, you can save a list of employers by using the "My List" feature. Your custom list is saved for two weeks each time you access it; you can add or remove employers from the list and even download a file to create a mail merge.**

6. I'm interested in corporate, securities, and real estate law. How can I find employers with these practice areas?

➔ **The *NALP Directory* lets you search employers according to any area of law that interests you.**

7. I am an LL.M. student. How can I find information on employers that hire LL.M.s?

➔ **You can generate a list of employers who indicate they consider LL.M.s by selecting that criteria under "Organizations that hire." The online *NALP Directory* also provides information about LL.M. hiring that is not contained in the print edition, including application deadlines and preferred application materials.**
