

# Market for New Law Graduates Up, Topping 90% for First Time Since 2000

NALP research analyses for the Class of 2006 reveal an overall employment rate that increased for the second year in a row, to 90.7% of graduates for whom employment status was known — topping 90% for the first time since 2000. This compares with a rate of 89.6% for 2005, 88.9% for 2004 and 2003, 89% for 2002, 90% for 2001, and 91.5% for 2000.

The Class of 2006 marks the 33rd consecutive year for which NALP has documented employment experiences of JD graduates,


and over the past decade the employment market for new law school graduates has remained relatively strong, standing close to or above an 89% employment rate since 1997. This contrasts with the early and mid 1990s, when employment rates were in the 84-85% range.

A total of 182 ABA-accredited law schools participated in the survey and provided employment information on 40,186, or 91.5% of all graduates, a coverage rate just slightly above that for the Class of 2005. Of those

graduates for whom employment status was known, 75.3% obtained a job for which bar passage is required. An additional 7.9% obtained jobs for which a JD is preferred, or may even be required, but for which bar passage is not required. Comparable figures for the Class of 2005 were 74.3% and 7.5%, respectively. The percentage of graduates employed in other capacities was 6.4%, the same as for the Class of 2005. As has been the case in recent years, most jobs, about 95%, were reported as full-time. Over 2% of 2006


## Initial Employment by Type of Employer

graduates were pursuing an advanced degree full-time, leaving about 7% who were not working or pursuing an advanced degree as of February 15.

Other findings from *Jobs & JD's: Employment and Salaries of New Law Graduates — Class of 2006*:

- As in all prior years that NALP has collected job information, most employed graduates (55.8%) chose private practice, the same as in 2005, and a figure that has fluctuated only between 55% and 58% since 1993.
- Employment in business was 14.2% compared with 13.2% in 2005, thus marking the third consecutive increase in this figure and matching the previous high set in 1996. About 34% of these jobs were reported as

requiring bar passage, and 30% were reported as JD preferred. About 11% of these business jobs represent graduates working for agencies that place individuals in temporary legal, law clerk, or paralegal jobs.

- Public service jobs, including military and other government jobs, judicial clerkships, and public interest positions, accounted for 26.9% of jobs taken by employed graduates, compared with 27.1% for the prior year. Public interest organizations, including public defenders, accounted for 5.4% of jobs, compared with 4.8% in 2005.

There is much more to discover about the most recent developments in law school graduate employment. What are new law graduates earning? Are most law firm oppor-

tunities in large firms or small? How did women and minorities from the Class of 2006 fare? What cities and states offer the most employment opportunities, and where should a graduate look for the best-paying jobs?


