### b. Bar Exam Issues (Vice-chair: Clara Solomon, NYU)

New York State has adopted the Uniform Bar Exam (UBE) starting in July 2016. The Section is monitoring any potential changes that may result for LLM students. The Section has also recently partnered with the LSAC LLM Network in collecting queries to present to the NY Board of Law Examiners for further clarification. We will plan to distribute relevant information from BOLE to Section members as we receive it.

On the Pro Bono requirement front, our Section will continue to monitor potential adoption of the requirement by California and resulting impact on LLM students.

#### II. Environmental Scanning

a. In our section meeting at the Annual Conference, we discussed visa issues, particularly related to international JD students. Approximately 15% or more of most JD programs now include international students, but many employers are digging their heels and are reluctant to hire students who would require visa sponsorship. There was a lot of discussion on the schools' response to this. Some schools include "immigration status" in their non-discrimination policy, rather than national origin, and could theoretically ban a firm from coming to campus if they are unwilling to interview students on a visa. We discussed tapping resources from other schools/departments (i.e. business schools) that provide handouts/information for employers on hiring foreign students.

### III. Planned agenda topics for next quarterly call in October:

- a. Update on RFP selections
- b. Request for Additional Bulletin Articles and Webinars. Possible topics to discuss and assign:
  - Expansion of and advising for non-degree post JD programs (certificates, etc.) and for non-lawyer Master's programs (MSL style programs)
  - Advising of students in online LLM programs
  - Potential Webinar: LLM Advising 101
- c. For schools that don't participate in the LLM job fairs in January/February there has been discussion over what other resources are available to those students. The NALP Directory currently has an option to search by "Hires Foreign LLMs" and "Hires Domestic LLMs", but the Section would like to investigate something more robust.
- d. Discuss putting together a group to work on a handout for employers on hiring international JD students. (See II.a. above).
